2025 Student Choice Award Application Submission Form

The Student Choice Award for Holistic Advising recognizes postsecondary institutions that have undergone holistic advising redesign efforts supported by cross-functional teams to increase completion and success indicators for all students, including Black, Latinx/a/o, Indigenous, Asian, and Pacific Islander students and poverty-affected students.

Student reviewers will present this award to institutions that demonstrate a commitment to the inclusion of student voices and perspectives in holistic advising redesign projects and initiatives.

Award winners will receive between \$1,000.00 - \$10,000.00, with the amounts determined by the student reviewers.

We anticipate that it may take up to one hour to complete this application, though it may take more time if a group is involved for collaboration on the application responses.
