Applications will be reviewed using the criteria below. Reviewers will score each area on a 1-3 scale, using the descriptors provided to assess overall alignment, strength, and readiness for participation.

- 3 – Strong/Exemplary

**Eligibility Requirements (Screened, Not Scored)**

Applications must also meet the following eligibility requirements to advance to scoring:

- U.S.-based state higher education systems or statewide coordinating or governing entities that oversee multiple postsecondary institutions
- Advising or pathways redesign launched between 2015 and 2020
- Evidence of at least five years of sustained work
- Identification of 3 participating institutions
- Submission of a senior leadership letter of support
- Confirmation of ability to participate over the project period (March 2026–March 2027)

**Overall Selection Approach**

Final selections will be based on rubric scores and consideration of cohort balance across system types, institutional contexts, and advising models. The goal is to assemble a diverse and informative group of systems that can contribute meaningfully to shared learning.
